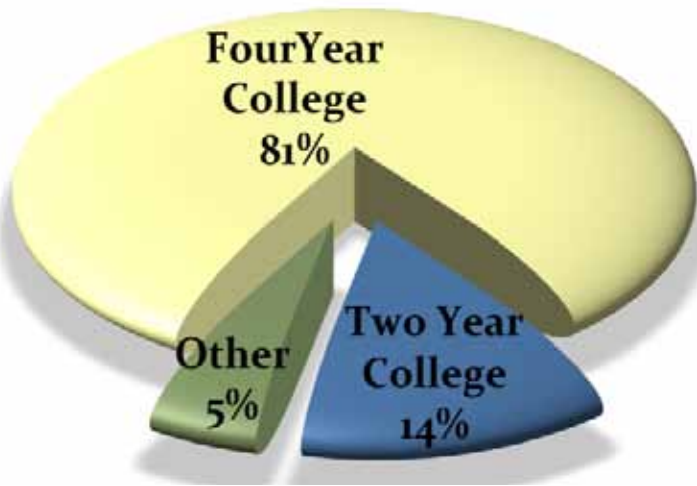

**Grading Policy:** In accordance with the Board of Education Policy, students are not ranked by cumulative averages relative to their classmates. The grades for individual courses are reported as earned. The minimum passing grade is 65. Grades are weighted in all Regents Level (1.02), honors (1.08), advanced placement and college level (1.10) courses. Both the weighted and unweighted cumulative averages are reported on the transcript.
